Conclusions:

- Processes of PM – be it hard to, or easy to – can be used beyond the world of economic projects, however, usage is complicated by the lacking knowledge of those employing it regarding the processes, knowledge areas of project management. The opinions regarding the applicability of knowledge areas deviate strongly, more so than for the cycles.
- The more project work someone was a part of, the stronger they feel that the tools and knowledge areas of PM can be employed in private life.
