The “host” of the fieldwork, the Noesis 3D Innovation and Education Centre. The Centre was created in 2017 with the aim to offer detailed introduction for sectors, target markets’ actors and those interested in technology into 3D printing that’s becoming more and more popular nowadays. The Centre’s creators realised that currently, there’s a large void in the market that lacks educational organisations offering an overall knowledge into additive production’s digital process integration. As part of this, the goal of the Centre is to introduce and teach the innovative knowledge regarding 3D printing and virtual planning during their courses.

The courses – mostly because of the type of topic – are practical in nature. The educators are aiming to use the so-called Project Based Learning.

The fieldwork was conducted with the participation of the EUROPÉER Foundation, the Romanian partner organisation, representatives of interested organisations and enterprises.

During the fieldwork:

- representatives of the Centre showed examples about PBL education’s practical application, and introduced current experiences and plans
- the representatives of the foundation introduced the Project Life Management programme, the methodology used for educating project management at universities, and the Romanian experiences related to teaching project management.
- the participants identified the relating points between the two methodologies, and talked about how these could be used for participating organisations and enterprises.

As part of the fieldwork, presenters detailed employed methods and best practices as well. They stressed the possible integration of their used methods, experiences and best practices into a PLM concept.

The fieldwork was also a great opportunity to create and strengthen international ties.
