REPORT ON THE SECOND WORKSHOP  
14.03.2018  
KOLOZSVÁR

On 14. March, 2018, the Hungarian organisation EUROPÉER Foundation's representatives visited the Romanian partner organisation, Pro Oeconomica Fellowship's Kolozsvár home, where not only the Hungarian and Romanian partners, but the representative of the Slovakian partner, Dr. József Poór also made an appearance.

With the help of the Romanian partner organisation's executive, Kinga Kerekes, the participants first went to the Faculty of Economics and Economic Management of the Babeş-Bolyai Scientific University, where the major evaluating programmes of project management and public management took place. This is clear proof that educating project management both in Hungary and abroad is a worthy aspiration. Following this, a professional discussion took place in the commons of the university's Economics and Economic Management, Hungarian Institute, where the Romanian partner organisation, Pro Oeconomica Fellowship was introduced. The Romanian partners showed the international scientific results of the partner organisation, its most notable tasks and goals. In the next part of the discussion, the Romanian partner's to-dos were discussed, and the details of the tasks to be done were finalised.

After the discussion, the consultation continued in the L'Achimiste restaurant as the side dish to a lunch between the Romanian, Slovakian and Hungarian executives of the project, while the professional duties taken up were also finalised.

The afternoon programme of the workshop was done in the event hall of the Museum Association of Transylvania, where Györgyi Lakatosné Szuhai vice-executive, the concept designer and leader of the PLM programme held a public presentation, introduced the programme, and listed its scientific results so far.



The Hungarian executives were asked to hold the presentation by the representatives of the Romanian partner organisation, so that both they and members of the audience get to know more about the applicability of project management's methods and tools to private life and public education. The openness and high level of interest of the audience was proven by two hours of interactive discussion after the presentation.

The first successful professional cooperation with the Romanian partner offered a newfound vigour to the programme's further development, and the promotion of project-based life management, as positive feedback and openness for cooperation, not to mention the general interest are clear indicators of the programme's success.
