

PROJECT LIFE MANAGEMENT (PLM)
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COMPETENCE DEVELOPMENT AS PART OF
AN INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION
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VIENNA

The main goal of the Vienna visit, the international experience transfer with the Austrian partner organisation SIETAR Austria was mainly to discuss further tasks to be done as part of the project, and to discuss the details of the study and research to be delivered by the partner organisation. This concerned the project management methods, and tools' usage in private life in Austria.



The representatives of the Austrian partner organisation – Daphne Demetriou, Alexander Müller, Barbara Covarrubias Venegas – introduced the Hungarian experts the organisation of SIETAR Austria, its main goals, research results as part of a presentation, followed by summarising the main pillars and results of the

study they made. Similarly to domestic experiences, literature to process was in short supply for the Austrian research as well, which is why they began an online survey, and conducted interviews with experts knowledgeable in the topic.

The results of the Austrians is similar to that of domestic research also in terms of the fact that even though the experts they asked also believed that getting to know project management tools and methods as early as possible, the actual education of project management starts only at middle-school level. Looking at the education of adults, Austrian partners reported that during the research, they barely found any courses or modules specifically made for project management methods and tools. And for using said methods and tools for private life, they only found references and some Austrian examples.

In the latter part of the discussion, knowing the results obtained, further research goals and tasks were considered.
