Topic 1: PLM 2017 private individual research results, discussion

Summary of the discussion:

- Notable role of the preparatory phase
- Importance of visualisation, strength of visualised tasks
- Knowledge of project management methodology, and connections to private life planning
- Efficiently made written plans' tools and deadlines, and indicators which can be evaluated

Conclusions:

- The methodology of project management is a lifestyle, which helps us in our private lives easily, which means we can make written plans with deadlines and concrete tasks for our everyday use.
- People usually make written plans, projects for themselves, their families, perhaps their colleagues. Those that know project management's principles and methods well, create plans for themselves in about 60%, while plans for family get written much more rarely. Plans or projects made for family members show strong connection to level of PM knowledge.
- Those who create plans for themselves mostly have concrete and evaluable indicators.

- Evaluation, and the monitoring of processes is less apparent for managing our everyday lives compared to plan indicators, however, even in this case, we can see that monitoring deadlines and planning variables have a significant connection to each other.
