

DETAILS OF THE JOINT PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMMES WITH THE PARTNERS

LILLAFÜRED

The 14. October event was organised in Lillafüred, where the representatives of the EUROPÉER Foundation, representatives of the Slovakian partner Selye János University, and representatives of the Romanian and Croatian partners were participating.

The event's participants discussed the framework of further cooperative relations during a free trekking experience, and pinpointed further dimensions of the PLM research.

The market analyses, data collection and other research already conducted supported the claim that there's not only a need, but a demand for the project management toolset and methodology, as a family and private life aid. However, the novelty of the PLM methodology, and the fear of using it seem to currently be a challenge for people towards using this well-structured and useful asset. In order to make the methodology spread as widely as possible both in Hungary and abroad, participants of the brainstorming agreed that they will continue assisting the progress of PLM by staying open to cooperation in the future.

As the project management method's applicability to private life, or lack thereof, is not an area in scientific literature today, the members of the think tank concluded that they'll keep researching this in the future, based on current results.

The fact that the logical structure and toolset of project management can be applied to planning private life is already proven, only realisation methodology still raises questions, for example, inclusion of stakeholders, or rationalising the emotional decision-making process.

To conclude the talks, participants agreed that further research should focus on actualisation methodology, so that PLM may become a methodological signpost that can be applied to detailed, all-encompassing assistance.
